

# Dyce and Stoneywood Community Council

Minutes of the Dyce and Stoneywood Community Council meeting of 4 October 2006 held at Dyce Community Centre.

1) Nancy Cruickshank opened the meeting at 7:30pm.

2) The minutes of the previous meeting were approved (proposed by Nancy, seconded by Ken.)

3) Police: Sgt. Craig introduced himself and apologised for not having a full report as he was standing in for PC Ritchie at the last minute.

He said that the Street Football had been very successful with an average of 50 boys attending. A receipt was passed to Helen our Treasurer for the donation given to the Street Football initiative and he thanked the Community Council for our interest.

4) Planning.

There was no report on Planning but Cllr. Clark assured the Council that there was nothing that required our attention at that time.

5) Traffic.

Overton Circle – Double Yellow Lines will be laid at the entrance to Overton Circle on both sides of the road up to the entrance of the Marriott Hotel – the road will also become a 20mph as will Glenhome Walk taking the traffic up to the Primary School. No humps will be laid.

Cllr. Clark has requested yellow lines on Farburn Terrace to restrict parking near the Skean Dhu Hotel up to the roundabout.

Resurfacing work is being done on Riverview Drive but only up to Todlaw Walk. Apparently that is as far as the budget allows this year.

## 6) Environment

The Central Park has been tidied up in relation to the overgrown shrubbery etc.

Another environmental meeting at the Airport on 13 December – Bill to attend – Report later.

AOCB:

The Small Improvements Budget was discussed.

There had been a suggestion that the Council could help the Dyce and District Community Car Association who were struggling but the latest information was that they were closing down the group and hopefully it would be picked up by the Red Cross.

It was then suggested that we could help with the cost of the Xmas Lights and the Xmas Tree on Victoria Street which is appreciated by everyone. Every year another two or three have been added and a few more are required to cover the full length of the street.

If this is appropriate under the criteria of the budget the council voted for this project.
